Explain how the Petitioner's substantial interests are being affected by the LFO's interpretation of the NFPA citation above: Loss of Revenue and Security. Reduction in design efficiency with increase cost.

Enter a statement of the LFO's interpretation of the NFPA citation above and identify the manner in which the statement was rendered:

For non-sprinklered structures, no portion of a building's exterior wall may exceed 150 ft. in travel distance from the fire department access road. For sprinkled structures, the minimum increases to 450 ft. (FFPC 1.18.2.3.2.2, FFPC 1.18.2.3.2.2.1). In projects similar to yours, this has been achieved by separating the perimeter buildings at intervals by a marked fire lane.

Enter a statement of the interpretation that the Petitioner contends should be given to the NFPA citation above and a statement supporting the Petitioner's interpretation:

In this case, the exterior walls of the perimeter buildings (identified as Building A, B, C & D on the attached) are effectively 40' or less from the fire access road, so no change to our plan should be required. The exterior buildings in question are non-residential metal buildings with depths ranging from 10' to 40'. Each unit has a roll-up garage door and there are no interior hallways, so the exterior walls of the building are immediately accessible from the fire access road through the garage doors.

Explain how the Petitioner's substantial interests are being affected by the question below: If we follow the LFO's interpretation, we will have to create separations at multiple points in the perimeter building. This will needlessly reduce square footage and revenue, reduce the security provided by the continuous perimeter building, reduce design efficiency and increase construction cost.

Enter the Petitioner's question concerning an interpretation of the FFPC:


Since the perimeter building has the qualities described in Section II (non-residential, 40' or less in depth, no interior hallways, roll-up garage doors), is the exterior wall of the building considered 40' (or less) from the fire access road as currently designed?
